
will talk with you about the things that you feel you best can do.




Monthly Reflection

Vegan Cranberry Sauce

Original recipe makes 11 servings

Ingredients

12 ounces cranberries

1 cup white sugar

1 cup orange juice



Vegan Gravy

Original recipe makes 4 servings

1/4 cup canola oil

1/3 cup all-purpose flour

1/4 cup vegetable broth

3 tablespoons tamari sauce

2 cups soy milk

2 tablespoons nutritional yeast Ground black pepper to taste



Vegan Corn Muffins Original recipe makes 6 servings

1 1/2 teaspoons egg replacer (dry)

2 tablespoons water

1 cup yellow cornmeal

1/2 cup all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking powder

2 tablespoons white sugar

2 tablespoons vegetable oil

1 cup water 1/2 tsp salt

Directions

In a medium sized saucepan over medium heat, dissolve the sugar in the orange juice. Stir in the cranberries and cook until the cranberries start to pop (about 10 minutes). Remove from heat and place sauce in a bowl. Cranberry sauce will thicken as it cools.-Allrecipes.com

Directions

Heat oil in a skillet over medium heat. Whisk flour, vegetable broth, and tamari into hot oil; cook and stir until there are no lumps and the mixture becomes paste-like, about 5 minutes. Pour soy milk into the skillet; cook and stir until the mixture thickens, about 5 minutes more. Add yeast and black pepper; Stir.-Allrecipes.com


Directions

Preheat oven to 450 degrees F (230 degrees C). Grease six muffin cups or line with paper muffin liners. In a small bowl, beat together egg replacer and water. In a separate bowl, combine cornmeal, flour, baking powder, sugar and salt. Add egg mixture, oil and water; stir until smooth. Spoon batter into prepared muffin tins using approximately 1/2 cup for each muffin. Bake in pre-heated oven for 10 to 15

minutes, until a toothpick inserted into the center of a muffin comes out clean. -Allrecipes.com

We have fundraisers online and attend local events to promote our work.





Help be the voice!



Each year, tens of thousands of animals are killed to test industrial chemicals, including those found in common household products. These animals suffer terribly, as harsh chemicals are rubbed into their skin, forced down their throats and dropped in their eyes. Legislation could go far to help these animals, but we need your support to get it passed. The Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act (S. 697), introduced by Sens. Tom Udall, D-N.M. and David Vitter, R-La, would improve the science behind chemical testing, encourage better safety decisions to protect the environment and human health and would reduce -if not eliminate -- the use of animals.

Please make a brief, polite call to your two U.S. Senators now. Look up your legislators' phone numbers. You can simply say: "Please support S. 697 to improve the science behind chemical testing to help animals." After making your call (please do not skip that crucial step!), fill in and submit the form below to send a follow-up message. Dear Senator,

As your constituent, I urge you to cosponsor The Frank R.
Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act (S. 697), if you haven't already done so.
Introduced by Sens. Tom Udall, D-N.M. and David Vitter, R-La., and cosponsored by a bipartisan group of 50 other lawmakers, this bill is poised for Senate floor activity.

Each year, tens of thousands of animals die horrific deaths for the purpose of testing industrial chemicals, including ingredients found in common household products. Some of these tests have been in use since before the Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976 and involve administering chemicals over a prolonged period of time, causing horrific deaths.

S.697 would significantly improve the science behind chemical testing and encourage better safety decisions to protect the environment and human health. It would also reduce -- if not eliminate -- the use of animals by:

- requiring the use of existing validated alternatives to animal testing where available;
- prioritizing the research and development of new methods; and
 requiring that every other way of obtaining information is tried before animal testing can be used.

The bill calls for quickly identifying chemicals most likely to pose health problems, and focusing resources on testing those chemicals more thoroughly. It is a practical and commonsense approach that would save time and money, because a full battery of safety tests can take more than a decade at the cost of tens of millions of dollars and thousands of animal lives.

Scientists and regulators around the world -- including the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency -- agree that the new science is the best way forward as it minimizes and ultimately eliminates animal testing.

Please support this important legislation. Vote yes on S.697.


